

The study programme Historical and Cultural Heritage (state code – 621V70002) at European Humanities University is given a positive evaluation. In total evaluation area got 19 points.

The programme aims and intended learning outcomes are generally well articulated and communicated. The intended learning outcomes need to be reviewed to take better account of actual skills development in the programme. Further research and curriculum development relating to the suitability of teaching provision in relation to the job market would be beneficial. The area got 3 points (good).

Curriculum design is good and study subjects are spread evenly. More attention to the latest critical debates in Heritage Studies at the international level would improve the programme, and teaching provision in English could beneficially be increased. The area got 3 points (good).

The teaching staff are suitably qualified and highly committed. Structures to improve the research environment and develop staff members' research careers should be identified by EHU administration. The area got 3 points (good).

The facilities and learning resources are adequate, but staff working accommodation, opportunities for relevant practical work by students within the curriculum and library holdings could be improved. The area got 3 points (good).

The study process is well managed, as is the programme management. However, the expertise and goodwill of social partners and alumni should be cultivated and exploited for the benefit of the programme, for example in the creation of an official social partners' forum, and measures to reduce the number of drop-outs should be taken. Formal mechanisms for student involvement in programme management should be developed. The area got 4 and 3 points (very good) (good).
